4. Bike Park Review and Comment

Mellissa Meng, Bicycle Programs Manager, North Natomas Jibe, (916) 419-9955, mellissa@jibe.org 6:04 p.m.

- Committee expressed support for the proposed project area in North Natomas Regional Park.
- Presenter clarified the project needs \$1.5M more in funding to acquire the proposed site.
- Member was concerned about how patrolling would be incorporated to prevent potential vandalism. It was suggested a volunteer schedule be opened to allow for the community to participate.
- Committee member suggested adding rapid charging stations for electric bikes, as the State is close to approving rebates which will spur further growth in e-bike users.
- It was further suggested that bike lockers would be a good addition as well.
- Repair stations was also recommended by the Committee.

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- Member prompted DOT Staff to share these ideas with other County departments—such as Regional Parks—to explore the possibility of implementing this project's elements at other locations. (e.g. Adding more punt tracks to existing parks, such as Gibson Ranch)
- DOT Staff confirmed this plan will be forwarded to County Parks, and pointed out that bike parks are prohibited by the American River Parkway Plan.
- Member suggested adopting elements from bike parks abroad, such as using half-sized traffic lights to simulate three-way stops, for kids learning bicycle and road safety. (Portable, miniature traffic lights with no electricity required are available in the City of Roseville)
- Committee members were interested in exploring how alternative energy could be generated from the bike park. (e.g. Fixed bikes that are able to produce power when utilized) Applying for SMUD Solar Grants was also suggested.
- Presenter clarified the greatest cost of the project would be the blacktop paving.

Summary: Sacramento County DOT staff invited SACOG to provide an update on the Regional Trail Network, approved by the SACOG Board of Directors in April 2023, followed by trail prioritization in August 2022. The Regional Trail Network is attached and can be viewed online at www.readysettrails.com

Counties like Sacramento serve a vital role in connecting communities to each other in the regional trail—35 miles of existing trail connections are in unincorporated Sacramento County. Sacramento County includes 104 miles of planned trails in the Regional Trail Network, and close to 40 miles of trail study corridors, which are connections identified for further study in future planning documents, planned connections with known implementation challenges, and high-concept connections. Sacramento County has also been awarded funding to construct connections within the Regional Trail Network since the adoption of the trail plan and prioritization.


Funding Source(s): The Regional Trail Network study was funded with a Caltrans Sustainable Communities grant and SACOG Transportation Development Act funds.

Background Information:

Between 2019 and 2022, SACOG led the Sacramento Region Parks and Trails Strategic Development Plan to identify a regional trail vision and strategic implementation approach for a connected trail system across all six counties. The strategic development plan identified how we grow the Regional Trail Network to create low-stress active transportation access for disadvantaged populations to parks and other community destinations—SACOG's 2020 analysis uncovered that connected trail access for lower-income residents is 30 percent less than connected trail access for average- and higher-income residents in our region.


The final trail network focuses on equitably creating regional trail connectivity and increasing access to the destinations that support the vitality and livability of the region. Most of the identified connections (over 250 miles of existing trails and more than 800 miles of planned trails) are selected from local plans for their potential to make connections across boundaries in the region. Over 300 miles of trail study corridors are also identified for their potential to connect via trails or trail-like facilities across the region.








The planned network collectively achieves regionally significant outcomes—it will increase access for 406,000 residents, or a 17.1 percent increase over existing trail access conditions. Locally identified study areas can help fill in remaining gaps in the trail network and further expand access to residents.


- Project awarded April 11. Construction should start in late May.
- Five striping plans (80% plans attached): 14th Avenue, 41st Avenue, Elkhorn Boulevard, Hazel Avenue, and North Parkway. Highlights:
 - Elkhorn Blvd: Existing to buffered bike lanes.
 - North Pkwy: Existing to separated bike lanes (south of Steiner Dr).
- 2. AC Overlay 2023 Phase B:
 - Awarded project March 1. Construction started in early April.
 - No striping plans. All residential roads.
- 3. AC Overlay 2023 Phase C:
 - Awarded project May 9. Construction should start in early June.
 - Two striping plans (80% plans attached): Briggs Drive and Elsie Avenue. Highlights:
 - Briggs Dr: Existing to separated bike lanes.
- 4. AC Overlay 2023 Phase D:
 - Advertise project for bids in August. Construction should start in October.
 - Four striping plans (no plans drafted): Elkhorn Boulevard, North Avenue, Vintage Park Drive, Watt Avenue. Highlights:
 - o <u>Elkhorn Blvd</u>: Likely turn existing into buffered bike lanes.
 - o North Ave: Likely add separated bike lanes near Mission Ave (1,000 ft).
 - Vintage Park Dr: Existing separated bike lanes.
 - o <u>Watt Ave</u>: Attempt to turn existing into separated or buffered bike lanes.
- 5. AC Overlay 2023 Phase E:
 - Project to be awarded May 23. Construction should start late June.
 - Five striping plans (80% plans attached): Shenandoah Drive, Grand Island Road, Isleton Road, Harvey Road, and Twin Cities Road.
- 6. AC Overlay 2023 Phase F:
 - Advertise project for bids in June. Construction should start in August.
 - Three likely striping plans (no plans drafted): 6th Parkway, Sky Parkway, and Watt Avenue. Highlights:









PAVEMENT DELINEATION PLAN AC OVERLAY 2023 PHASE E FOOTHILL FARMS NEIGHBORHOOD





Summary: Safer Sacramento County seeks to improve transportation equity by means of pedestrian and bicycle-friendly infrastructure, a pedestrian wayfinding mobile app, and Intelligent Transportation System innovations. A Class IV separated bikeway (3.2 miles) and sidewalk infill are among planned installations to address challenges along Stockton Blvd, a high injury corridor. The wayfinding app will provide details on a route's accessibility for those who walk and roll, to be initially deployed to County Environmental Justice Communities and other disadvantaged communities. Finally, emergency vehicle signal preemption will be integrated along Stockton Blvd, Arden Way, Watt Ave, and Florin Rd, reducing response times of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District.

This project has an estimated cost of \$18,310,979, eighty percent (\$14,648,783) of which would be requested as Federal Share, the remaining twenty percent (\$3,662,196) would be Local Match.

Funding Source(s): 2023 USDOT Safe Streets and Roads for All

Background Information: Building on three pillars of the National Roadway Safety Strategy, Sacramento County Department of Transportation (SacDOT) proposes the Safer Sacramento County project which includes:

Safer Streets: Design, environmentally clear, and construct one-way Class IV separated bikeway (3.2 miles), sidewalk infill in six areas for a total length of 0.7 miles, signalization of one offset intersection, install fiber connection, and slurry seal and restripe roadway/bikeway on Stockton Boulevard from Florin Road to Mack Road/Elsie Avenue.

Safer People: Develop and deploy a pedestrian wayfinding mobile app that will give real time directions for walking and rolling, customized to the individual's mobility needs, along the sidewalk network. At selected major roadways, a person will be able to extend pedestrian minimum green time to cross. The app will be deployed in the four environmental justice communities in the County: South Sacramento, West Arden, North Highlands, Vineyard, and other areas designated federally as disadvantaged or serve a concentration of seniors and people with disabilities.

Post-Crash Care: Integrate emergency vehicle preemption into approximately 50 existing smart traffic controllers along four primary arterial corridors: Stockton Boulevard, Arden Way, Watt Avenue, and Florin Road, where emergency response times are above the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District's thresholds due to roadway congestion.

Summary: The Citrus Road Bike Path is a critical transportation link between the American River Parkway, retail shopping, community services, the Sunrise Light Rail Station, and current and future residential development. The path runs adjacent to the Mobil Country Club, a senior mobile home park where residents once used it to travel by foot, bike, and wheelchair for daily exercise, shopping, and connection to light rail. Residents of this community have voiced concerns about the lack of lighting, trash, illegal dumping, and personal safety as the main reasons the path is not a community asset in its current state.

The Clean California Program grant application will fund place-making investments that encourage the community to gather, enjoy the natural environment, walk, and ride through this underutilized corridor once again. This project is a fantastic opportunity for the City of Rancho Cordova to promote local pride through a bike path beautification project.

Funding Source(s): Clean California Local Grant Program

Background Information: The project extents cross jurisdictions between Rancho Cordova and Unincorporated Sacramento County. The two entities share jurisdiction along the portion of the Citrus Road/Sunrise Corridor Bikeway from Folsom Blvd to Coloma Road, while the segment between Coloma Road to Sunrise Blvd fall exclusively within Unincorporated Sacramento County.

Rancho Cordova's Citrus Road Bike Path Improvements will include the following:

- Landscaping which includes native plants, pollinators, and bioretention planters to address drainage issues.
- Lighting to improve personal safety on the path and under the freeway underpass.
- Art in the forms of murals, gateway monument signs, wayfinding signs, and a sculpture.
- Repaving of the bike path asphalt, new striping, and path markers.
- Amenities which include seating, pet stations, and a bike counter displaying daily and annual users.
